Kelemen pápa idején (1523–1526)* [The Relations of the Holy See and Hungary in the Jagello Age with Special Regard to the Papacy of Clement VII (1523–1526)]. His supervisor was Kornél Szovák.

**Scholarships:**

Following the guidance of Kornél Szovák he examined the registers of bulls and of supplications, and based on the guidelines of Péter Tusor he analysed the 16<sup>th</sup> century consistorial acts in the Vatican Archives. The results of this latest research were published in 2011 in the *Collectanea Vaticana Hungariae* series with the title: *Consistorialia Documenta Pontificia de Regnis Sacrae Coronae Hungariae (1426–1605)*, edited by Gábor Nemes and Péter Tusor.
- He researched in 2007 and in 2008 three months in the Vatican Archives with Klebelsberg Kuno Scholarship. In the frame of this research he examined the 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> century registers of briefs and drafts of briefs.
